

Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) From Residential Properties Only

Following are examples of HHW:

- Used oil, paint, solvent, fertilizer and pesticide from residential properties. Waste materials from commercial properties cannot be managed as HHW.

Property owners shall properly remove hazardous or HHW from the property prior to MnDOT taking ownership of the building. Residential property owners can dispose of their HHW with their county HHW waste program. MnDOT is responsible for any remaining HHW after taking ownership of the building.

Disposal and Recycling Options for HHW

- Transport to a county HHW facility if the waste was removed from a residential building
 - Check with the HHW facility to see what they can accept.
 - The HHW facility may refuse to accept or may only accept limited quantities of used oil, solvents and paint.
 - Shipping papers should be completed to track wastes.
